

**CITY COUNCIL MEETING
OZARK, ALABAMA
TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 5, 2017**

The City Council of the City of Ozark, Alabama, met in Regular Session in the Council Chamber of the Municipal Complex at 5:30 P.M. on Tuesday, September 5, 2017. Upon roll call the following members were present:

Council President Garrett gave the prayer followed by Mayor Bunting leading everyone in the Pledge of Allegiance.

The Council having read the minutes from the Regular Council Meeting held on August 15, 2017 President Garrett asked the wishes of the Council. Councilmember Enfinger made a motion to approve the minutes of the Regular Council Meeting held on August 15, 2017, which motion was seconded by Councilmember Jackson. The Council voted unanimously in favor thereof.

President Garrett advised the Council it was time to set the Agenda and if there were any changes to be made. Councilmember Simechak made a motion to set the Agenda with the removal of 2124 N Union Avenue from Item #6, which motion was seconded by Councilmember Perault. The Council voted unanimously in favor thereof.

Councilmember Enfinger made a motion to Declare Excessive Weed Growth at 400 Don Circle, which motion was seconded by Councilmember Jackson. The Council voted unanimously in favor thereof.

Councilmember Jackson introduce a Resolution Declaring Certain Properties with Excessive Weed Growth a Public Nuisance at 2255 N Union Avenue and 1092 Campground Road and Set a Public Hearing for October 3, 2017 at 5:00 PM and moved for its adoption, which motion was seconded by Councilmember Siemchak. The Council voted unanimously in favor thereof.

Councilmember Enfinger introduced a Resolution Declaring Surplus Property in the Police and Vehicle Maintenance Department and moved for its adoption, which motion was seconded by Councilmember Perault. The Council voted unanimously in favor thereof.

Councilmember Jackson introduced a Resolution Declaring Surplus Real Property in the Administration Department and moved for its adoption, which motion was seconded by Councilmember Simechak. The Council voted unanimously in favor thereof.

Councilmember Jackson made a motion to authorize the Mayor to execute an agreement with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Mobile District, for Fort Rucker Animal Control Services, which motion was seconded by Councilmember Simechak. The Council voted unanimously in favor thereof.

Upon the recommendation of Captain Hicks Councilmember Simechak made a motion to approve the First and Second Reading of application 050-Retail Beer (Off Premise Only) and Application 070-Retail Table Wine (Off Premises Only). Applicant: OHM Mahakali LLC d/b/a Food Basket, 348 Andrews Avenue, Ozark, AL 36360. Owners: M. Patel and D. Patel, 114 Mosswood Drive, Enterprise, AL 36330, which motion was seconded by Councilmember Jackson. The Council voted unanimously in favor thereof.

Councilmember Perault made a motion to accept the resignation of Jenny Shawn from the Downtown Redevelopment Authority, which motion was seconded by Councilmember Enfinger. The Council voted unanimously in favor thereof.

Councilmember Enfinger made a motion to appoint Kim Moore to the Downtown Redevelopment Authority to fill the unexpired term of Jenny Shawn, which motion was seconded by Councilmember Perault. The Council voted unanimously in favor thereof.

Councilmember Simechak made a motion to re-appoint Winston Jackson to the E-911 Board of Commissioners, which motion was seconded by Councilmember Enfinger. The Council voted unanimously in favor thereof.

Council President Garrett advised the Council that there was a Financial Report in their packets.

With there being no further business to come before this Regular Council Meeting of September 5, 2017, Councilmember Enfinger made a motion to adjourn the meeting, which motion was seconded by Councilmember Jackson. The Council voted unanimously in favor thereof.
